

What is Emergency Management

Emergency Management - concerned with all phases of disasters: mitigation, preparedness, response and recovery.

What is Emergency Management

Emergency management (or disaster management) is the discipline of dealing with and avoiding risks. It is a discipline that involves preparing for disaster before it occurs, disaster response, and supporting, and rebuilding society after natural or manmade disasters have occurred.

Mission of Emergency Management

The mission of the Naperville Emergency Management Agency (NEMA) is to prepare for, protect against, respond to and recover from natural and manmade incidents and events up to and including major disasters. NEMA will provide support and education to the citizens, city government and the private sector within the City of Naperville.

NEMA's Mission

The Naperville Emergency Management Agency Volunteer Mission Statement:

To provide support services to Emergency Service Agencies and Disaster/Emergency situation response to Naperville and the surrounding area. This includes performing those duties and responsibilities as defined in Title 1 Chapter 8 of the Naperville Municipal code.

CERT Mission

 To Provide basic disaster survival and rescue skills to citizens so they can be self sufficient until first responders arrive.

- Run basic CERT training
- CERT volunteers that want to do more
- Volunteers active in other elements
- Have been used for sand bagging



Field Operations Unit

Provides

- Operational support to the Naperville Fire Department, other city agencies and Mutual Aid.
- Scene lighting for Fire and Police operations
- Support for Mass Casualty incidents
- Support for local Special Events

Communications Group


Provides:

- Ancillary communications during times of limited communications
- Communication support, as requested, during large scale incidents
- Logistics support during emergency situations
- Weather spotting services during potentially damaging weather situations
- Support for local Special Events

Weather Group

- Conducts "Weather Operations" during times of potentially damaging weather conditions
- Informs Emergency Services commanders of current and potential weather during potentially damaging weather conditions
- Provides training about weather to other response organizations and, as requested, the public
- Provides support for local Special Events

Search and Rescue Team Mission

The mission of the Search and Rescue (SAR) Team is to provide a qualified search team for local and mutual aid wilderness search incidents. The SAR Team will be affiliated with Will County Search and Rescue (SAR). The SAR Team will also provide support for community events and non-SAR incidents as appropriate.

SARS facts

EMA Operations Mission

The mission of the EMA Operations Unit is to provide support for community emergencies. During non-emergency conditions, the EMA Operations Unit will provide support for community activities (e.g. special events).

Citizen Corps Council (CCC) activities include:

- Education of residents about disaster preparedness measures
- Implement public education and outreach efforts
- Provides training to improve citizen preparedness, prevention and response to natural, technological, or terrorist incidents

Citizen Corps Council (CCC) activities include:

- Promoting the importance of drills in the home, workplace, and schools
- Coordinating citizen participation in community disaster response activities and educational events
- Coordinating volunteer opportunities that support local efforts in mitigation (prevention,) preparedness, response and recovery activities
